Language Arts

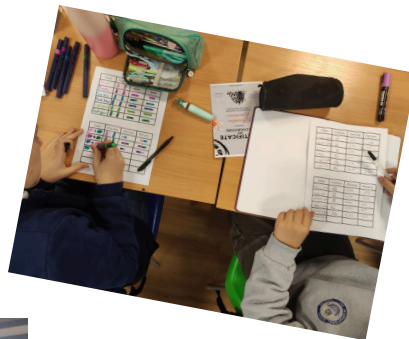


Math

Students practiced rounding numbers and completed several activities to practice this skill. We began the fractions, decimals, and percentages unit. Students worked on a Pixel Art Project and reviewed adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing fractions.

Science

We are learning about different types of animals and a group called protists. Protists are unique because they are not plants, fungi, or animals but share features with all three. We also studied nematodes, tiny worms that live in soil or as parasites.
